Understanding Vaccine Status	A leader may discreetly and directly ask about vaccination status for safety in scheduling purposes. Leaders must not engage in conversations about why an employee has not been vaccinated. Under all the new federal guidance, records of employee vaccinations must be kept in protected files, separate from employee personnel files. The ADA requires an employer to maintain the confidentiality of employee medical information, and this now includes documentation or other confirmation of

	COVID-19 vaccination. Managers can ask an employee to show their vaccination card to confirm that they are vaccinated. However, managers shouldn't keep a record of that vaccination card or a google doc with who is vaccinated.
